**LITERACY UNIT: Africa**

FOR THREE WEEKS each March, students in grades K-8 embark on a single-topic, cross-curricular, experiential learning journey accompanied by educational or cultural presentations or a field trip to augment classroom studies. During this time, Paris School learners are immersed in the selected topic and prepare projects for display in our upper hallway and a student-guided culmination assembly to demonstrate topic comprehension and application in each grade.

Last spring, Paris School learners explored the continent of Africa through engaging literature and experiences. Performers from The Village for African Cultural, Visual, and Performing Arts from West Dundee, IL, presented cultural music, dance, and storytelling to students in all grades. In addition, Paris School parent, Alpha Seisay, shared his knowledge and enthusiasm about his home country of Sierra Leone.

## PARIS SCHOOL FISCAL HIGHLIGHTS: 2017-18

- ❖ Student enrollment is **281** students. All grades are at capacity.
- ❖ Open Enrollment students into Paris decreased 5 students to a total of 130. Total revenue from Open Enrollment is **\$839,012**. This is a decrease of **\$33,740** from 2016-2017.
- ❖ Implementing additional new STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) curriculum in grades 1-5.
- ❖ Replaced all Intermediate Wing (North End) flooring with proper vapor barrier, subfloor, and tiles.
- ❖ Added Safety Bollards along front sidewalk and replaced cracked sections of front sidewalk.
- ❖ Removed and roofed over five old leaky roof vents that are no longer in use.
- ❖ Staff workroom and Speech/Language classroom remodeled thanks to PSO donation.

## PARIS SCHOOL DISTRICT HIGHLIGHTS: 2018-19 (TO DATE)

- ❖ Student enrollment is **277** students. All grades are at capacity.
- ❖ Open Enrollment students into Paris increased 11 students to a total of 141. Total revenue from Open Enrollment is **\$972,497**. This is an increase of **\$133,485** from 2017-2018.
- ❖ Implementing more new STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) curriculum in grades 1-5.
- ❖ Addition of iPads in Intermediate Wing for STEM implementation.
- ❖ Removed old north playground set and replaced with new climber/slide thanks to PSO donation.
- ❖ Added a beautiful new handicapped accessible playground set on south playground thanks to PSO donation.
- ❖ Installed 22 interior and exterior surveillance cameras and completed wiring for more cameras.

## PARIS SCHOOL BOARD GOALS: 2018-2019

Training, building improvements, and surveillance camera additions to enhance school safety.

Work with Paris Legacy Committee to explore Community Fitness Center on site.

Further Technology Initiative and STEM Classroom Integration.

Continue ongoing necessary building and grounds maintenance practices.

Increase Fund Balance to save for future revenue loss due to continued declining resident enrollment.

## MATH CURRICULUM UPGRADE TO Math Expressions:

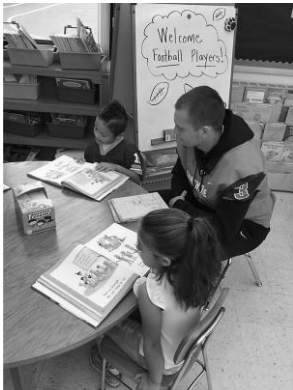
Math Expressions links with Osmo iPad technology to provide enrichment activities and further opportunities for hands-on learning.
