Our school year is off to a great start! In an effort to maintain positive effective communication between the school and our community we are sending you this informative packet. In years past, our district has published the legal notification of our annual budget and announcement of the budget hearing in the Kenosha News. A far less costly alternative is to mail the budget summary to our community. You'll note that the enclosed budget begins with the Notice of Budget Hearing, followed by the summary which contains the audited budget from 2018-19, audited budget from 2019-20, as well as the projected 2020-21 budget. The Budget Hearing itself is part of the District Annual Meeting, which will be held on Monday, October 26, 2020, at 7:00 p.m. in the gymnasium. All are invited to attend!

There are wonderful things going on here every day that we are excited to share, so also enclosed in this packet you will find information regarding our continued student academic success, fiscal highlights of our district, technology enhancement updates, information regarding the Paris School Foundation, and news from our Paris School Organization (PSO).

*An update about Paris School District financial gains and future goals.*

EVERY DAY THAT we are together at Paris School, we strive to provide the very best educational experiences for our students in a positive and safe learning environment. From the moment that Wisconsin schools were forced to close in mid-March, our goal was to get our students and staff back to school for the face-to-face instruction and social

interactions that are so crucial for the well-being and development of our young people. We never once wavered from that goal.

On September 1, we reopened Paris School to our students and staff. It was a truly joyous event! With

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our top priority being the safety of all in our school community, we rebuilt our schedule from the ground up and added staff to allow proper personal spacing. With the addition of three licensed substitute teachers for instructional support, as well as one 50% teacher in our junior high, we were able to split grades 3-8 in half. These smaller class sizes, along with using our Library, RTI Center, Music Room, Art Room, and full cafeteria as instructional areas have made it possible for our safe return to school. All students, staff, and families have worked together to start this school year off with amazing Panther Pride!

As this newsletter is our primary means of sharing our district budget with our community, it is important to point out that this year's projected budget is a deficit budget in the amount of \$52,356.58. This is due to our increased staffing and costs due

to COVID-19. With the uncertainty of how long we must maintain our COVID safety measures and protocols, we have budgeted the additional staff for the entire year and will review our staffing each trimester. Another note of greater importance is that, due to the closure of school for the final trimester last year, increased high cost Special Education Aid, and careful spending, our district attained a savings of \$315,914.82. This savings from 2019-20 went into our fund balance and will more than offset this year's potential deficit budget.

We are approaching eleven years since our operating referenda. With our district on continued firm financial ground, the Paris Jt. 1 Board of Education and Administrator, Roger Gahart, remain committed to providing the very best education for our students while demonstrating full transparency and fiscal responsibility to our community.

### PARIS SCHOOL FISCAL HIGHLIGHTS: 2019-20

- ❖ Student enrollment was **279** students. All grades were at capacity.
- ❖ Open Enrollment students into Paris decreased **11** students to a total of **130**. Total revenue from Open Enrollment was **\$912,101**. This was a decrease of **\$60,396** from 2018-19.
- ❖ Implemented additional new STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) curriculum in grades 1-5.
- ❖ Added iPads in Primary Wing for STEM and IXL implementation so we are now 1 to 1 with iPads for students in grades 1-5.
- ❖ Added additional Jr. High lockers to accommodate all Jr. High students thanks to PSO donation.
- ❖ Built a new kiln room within the Art classroom thanks to PSO donation.
- ❖ Installed new main entrance camera/intercom door strike and added seven additional exterior surveillance cameras thanks to Paris School Foundation.

**Paris School remains free of LONG-TERM DEBT and POST-EMPLOYMENT LIABILITIES.**

### PARIS SCHOOL DISTRICT HIGHLIGHTS: 2020-21 (TO DATE)

- ❖ Student enrollment is **280** students. All grades are at current capacity.
- ❖ Open Enrollment students into Paris remains at **130**. Total revenue from Open Enrollment is **\$969,918**. This is an increase of **\$57,817** from 2019-2020.
- ❖ Implementing additional new STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) curriculum in grades 1-8.
- ❖ Implementing new Reading Curriculum throughout grades K-5.
- ❖ Replaced eighth grade laptop computers as part of Technology Replacement/Update Schedule.
- ❖ Replacement of four old water fountains with filtered fountain/water bottle filling stations thanks to PSO donation.

For the next 35 years, Diane and her team fueled Paris School learners with homemade hot lunch items that aligned with Federal government nutrition standards and denied the need for contract food services hired by many school districts. Diane's most notable legacy is Paris School's famous Stromboli, a

recipe she discovered while searching for menu inspiration, tweaked to perfection, served to generations, and that remains, to this day, the school's most popular monthly hot lunch specialty.

When Diane retired in 2016, Roseanne Brinkman proudly took over with Nancy Hansen by her side. Together, they uphold Paris School's humble 71-year lunchtime legacy, buzzing with preparation to serve more than 150 students each day. Their early-morning aroma of freshly baking bread, the excitement of Stromboli Day, or the simple delight of amazing homemade molasses cookies tempt students and staff, alike, and bring a togetherness in the Paris School cafeteria that hungry kids may take for granted but decades of Paris School graduates appreciate forever. 🐾
