CLASS OF THE MONTH

6th Grade

Sixth graders are excited for the Ocean Exploration Unit! In science, sixth graders just finished a unit on the metric system and are excited to begin the exploration unit! Students will be learning about the concept of buoyancy and how it is utilized by submarines. To deepen their understanding, students will take part in a STEM challenge using the Engineering Design Process. Their mission: design, and build a water bottle submarine that can float and sink — without being touched! During the first half of February in social studies, we studied ancient Greece and Greek culture and how it influences society today. February finished off with the students creating a five-page pop-up book. The books have a non-fiction theme of anything regarding the ocean. In math, we have been working on playing, analyzing, and designing a game with the ocean in mind. We are looking forward to showing our creations with the rest of the junior high wing. During the Exploration Unit for ELA, the 6th graders will be reading *Escaping the Giant Wave*, which is about a tsunami that hits the Oregon coast.
